Your rights

You have several rights under data protection laws in relation to your personal data. Your rights are:

The right of access (commonly known as a "subject access request")

You are entitled to receive a copy of the personal data we may hold about you and to check we are lawfully processing it. The right to rectification. This enables you to have any incomplete or inaccurate data we hold about you corrected, though we may need to verify the accuracy of the new data you provide to us.

The right to erasure

This enables you to request deletion or the removal of your personal data where there is no good reason for us continuing to process it. You also have the right to ask us to delete or remove your personal data where you have successfully exercised your right to object to processing (see below), where we may have processed your information unlawfully or where we are required to erase your personal data to comply with local law.

Note, however, that we may not always be able to comply with your request of erasure for specific legal reasons which will be notified to you, if applicable, at the time of your request.

The right to restrict processing

You have the right to 'block' or suppress the processing by us of your personal data in one of the following :

- If you want us to establish the data's accuracy.
- Where our use of the data is unlawful, but you do not want us to erase it.
- Where you need us to hold the data even if we no longer require it as you need it to establish, exercise or defend legal claims.
- You have objected to our use of your data, but we need to verify whether we have overriding

legitimate grounds to use it.

The right to data portability

You have the right to request transfer of your personal data to you or to a third party. We will provide to you, or a third party you have chosen, your personal data in a structured, commonly used, machine-readable format. Note that this right only applies to automated information which you initially provided consent for us to use or where we used the information to perform a contract with you.

The right to object

To processing of your personal data where we are relying on a legitimate interest (or those of a third party) as the legal basis for that particular use of your data (including carrying out profiling based on our legitimate interests). In some cases, we may demonstrate that we have compelling legitimate grounds to process your information which override your right to object. – You also have the absolute right to object any time to the processing of your personal data for direct marketing purposes.

The data we collect about you

We may collect, use, store and transfer different kinds of personal data about you which we have grouped together as follows:

• Identity Data includes first name, last name, passports for identification and verification purposes as required by law

- Contact Data includes address, email address and telephone numbers.
- Technical Data including IP address, browser type and version, time zone setting and location,

operating system and platform, device ID and other technology on the devices you use to access this website. and cookies

• Usage Data includes information about how you interact with and use our website

How your data is collected

We use different methods to collected data from and about you.

You may give us your personal data by filling in online forms or by corresponding with us by post, phone, email or otherwise. This includes personal data you provide when you:

- Request or enquiry about our services.
- Use our website including any interactive features, for example to ask a question.
- Interact with us on social media.
- Contact us or give us feedback.
- Attend networking events where we are present.

Automated technologies or interactions.

As you interact with our website, we will automatically collect Technical Data about your equipment, browsing actions and patterns. We collect this personal data by using cookies and other similar technologies.

How your data will be used

The law requires us to have a legal basis for collecting and using your personal data. We rely on one or more of the following legal bases:

- Legitimate Interests: We may use your personal data where it is necessary to conduct our business and pursue legitimate interests. We make sure we consider and balance any potential impact on you and your rights (both positive and negative) before we process your personal data for our legitimate interests. We do not use your personal data for activities where our interests are overridden by the impact on you (unless we have your consent or are otherwise required or permitted to by law).
- Performance of a contract with you: Where we need to carry out our obligations arising from any contracts entered into between you and us or about to enter into.
- Legal Obligation: We may use your personal data where it is necessary for compliance with a legal obligation that we are subject to. We will identify the relevant legal obligation when we rely on this legal basis.
- Consent: We rely on consent only where we have obtained your active agreement to use your personal data for a specified purpose.

Purposes for which we will use your personal data

To register you as a new contractor, employee, customer, supplier or partner.

The purpose is in line with the legal requirements needed for – employee onboarding and lifetime management, payments, orders, queries, dispute resolution.

Disclosure of your personal data

We may share your personal data with the parties set out below.

We require all third parties to respect the security of your personal data and treat it in accordance with the law. We have contracts in place any third party we share your personal data with. This means that they cannot do anything with your personal data unless we have instructed them to do so or use the personal data for their own purposes. They will not share your personal data with any organisation apart from us.

Data Retention

We will only retain your personal data for as long as reasonably necessary to fulfil the purposes we collected it for, including for the purposes of satisfying any legal, regulatory, tax, accounting or reporting requirements.

We may retain your personal data for a longer period in the event of a complaint or if we reasonably believe there is a prospect of litigation in respect to our relationship with you.

To determine the appropriate retention period for personal data, we consider the amount, nature and sensitivity of the personal data, the potential risk of harm from unauthorised use or disclosure of your personal data, the purposes for which we process your personal data and whether we can achieve those purposes through other means, and the applicable legal, regulatory, tax, accounting, or other requirements.

By law we have to keep basic information about our customers (including Contact, Identity, Financial and Transaction Data for six years after they cease being customers for tax purposes.

Our data retention policy is available for inspection by submitting a written request using the contact details provided in this policy.

International transfers

We do not transfer your personal data outside the UK.

Changes

We keep our privacy notice under regular review. This version was last updated on 21/05/24. It is important that the personal data we hold about you is accurate and current. Please keep us informed if your personal data changes during your relationship with us, for example a new address or email address

Data Security

We have put in place appropriate security measures to prevent your personal data from being accidentally lost, used, or accessed in an unauthorised way, altered, or disclosed. In addition, we limit access to your personal data to those employees, agents, contractors and other third parties who have a business need to know. They will only process your personal data on our instructions, and they are subject to a duty of confidentiality.
